Healthy Snack Recipes: Granola & Yogurt Breakfast Popsicles

Ingredients: 1 ¼ cup low-fat plain yogurt; 1 ½ cups chopped fresh berries (strawberries, blueberries, raspberries); 4 tsp. pure maple syrup, divided; 1 tsp. vanilla extract; 6 tbsp. granola, large chunks crumbled.

Directions:

Six 3-ounce popsicle molds. Stir yogurt, berries, 2 teaspoons maple syrup and vanilla together in a medium bowl. Divide among six 3-ounce popsicle molds. Stir granola and the remaining 2 teaspoons maple syrup together in a small bowl. Top each popsicle with 1 tablespoon of the granola mixture. Insert popsicle sticks and freeze overnight.

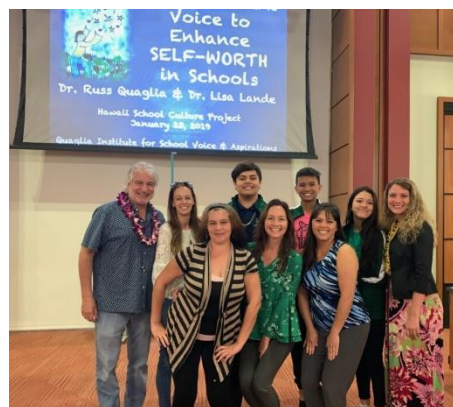
