Sweet and Smokey Turkey Chili

Ingredients:

1 small yellow onion, chopped; 2 garlic cloves, minced; 1 lb. of lean ground turkey; 1 can unsalted black beans; 1 can fire-roasted crushed tomatoes; 1 can fire-roasted diced tomatoes (drained); 1 ½ tbsp. chili powder; 1 tsp brown sugar; 1 tbsp. hot sauce; See salt and ground black pepper, to taste; Low-fat shredded cheese or a dollop of plain Greek yogurt (optional)

Instructions:

1. Sauté onion and garlic in skillet set on medium-high heat. Add turkey and beans and cook about 10 minutes
2. Add remaining ingredients and bring to a boil, then reduce heat to low. Cover skillet with a lid and let simmer for 2 hours, stirring occasionally. Remove from heat, garnish and serve.
